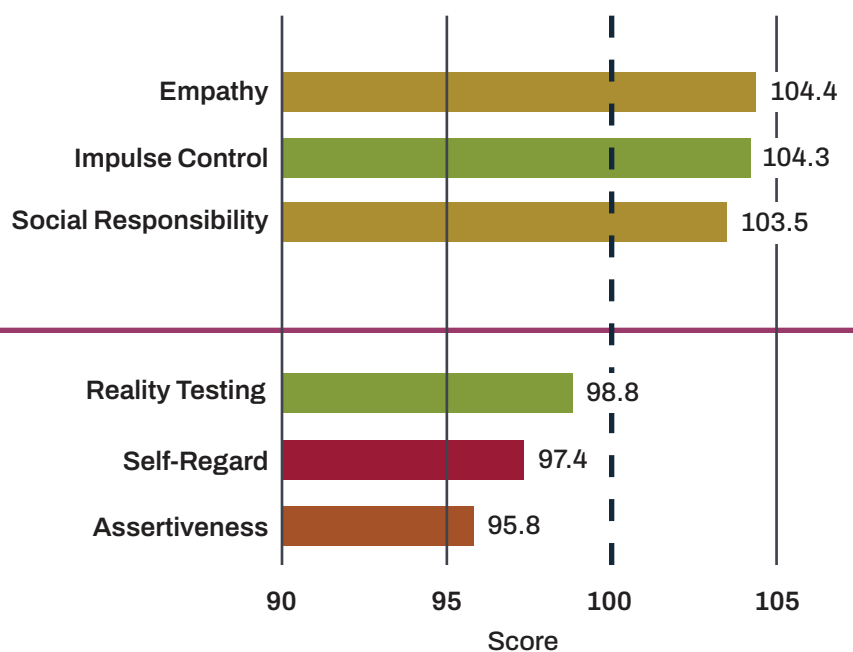


In different industries and occupations, some components of Emotional Intelligence (EI) may show up more strongly than others, illustrating the proficiencies needed to “get the job done.”

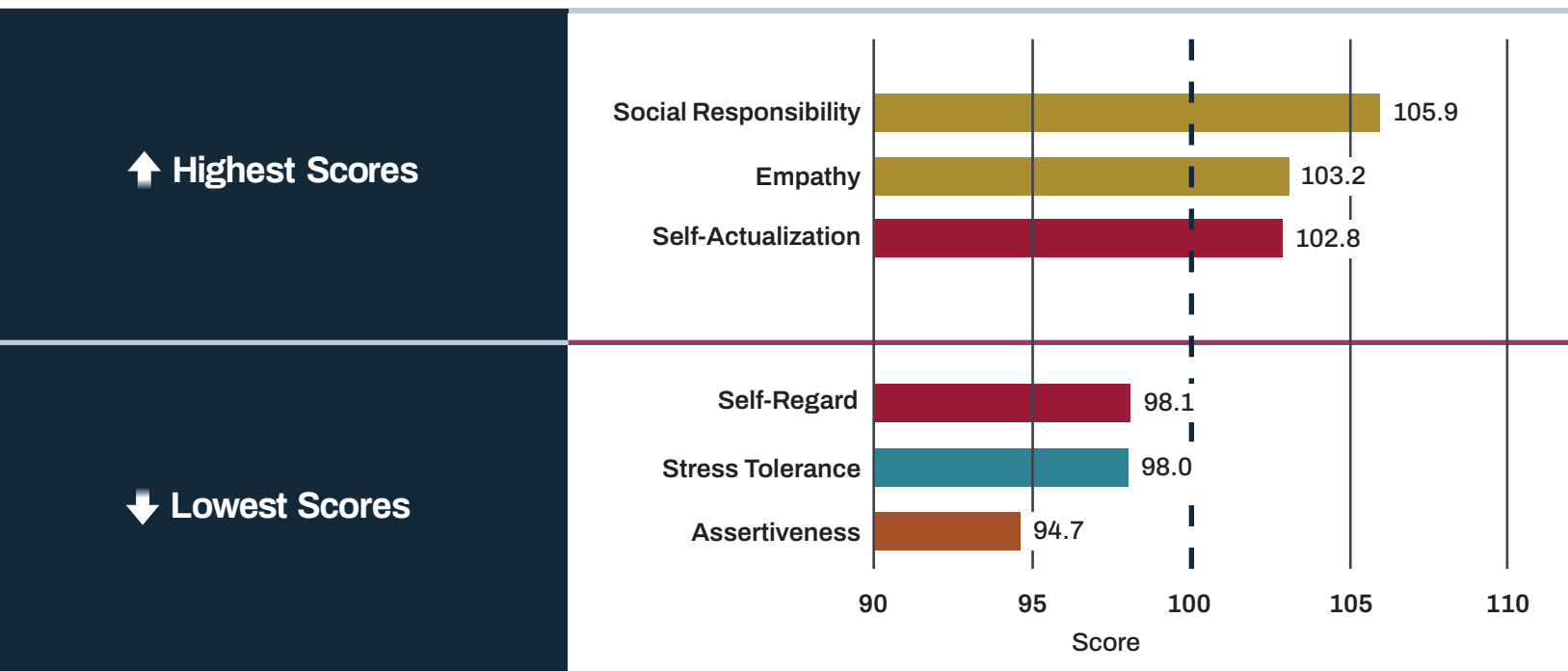

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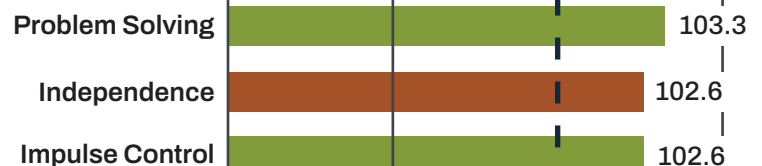

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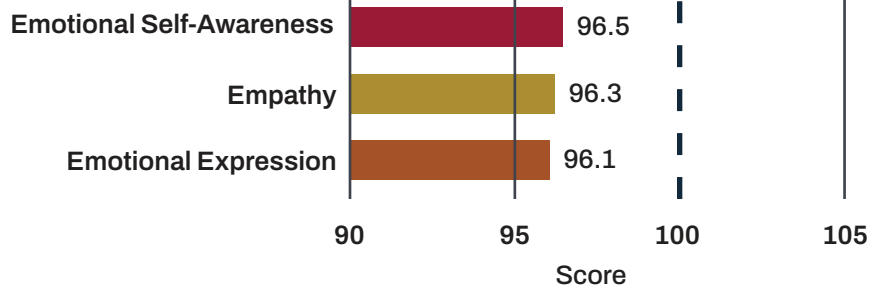

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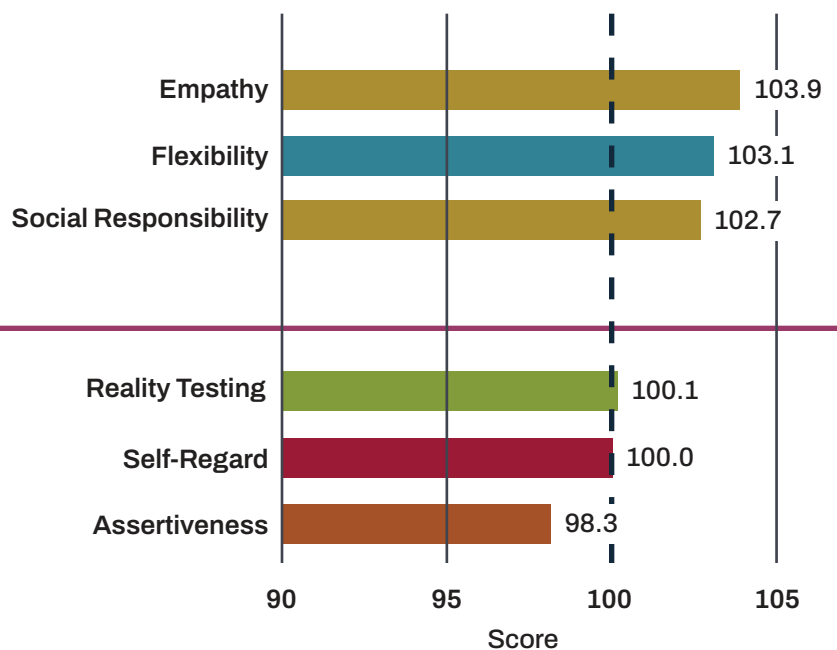

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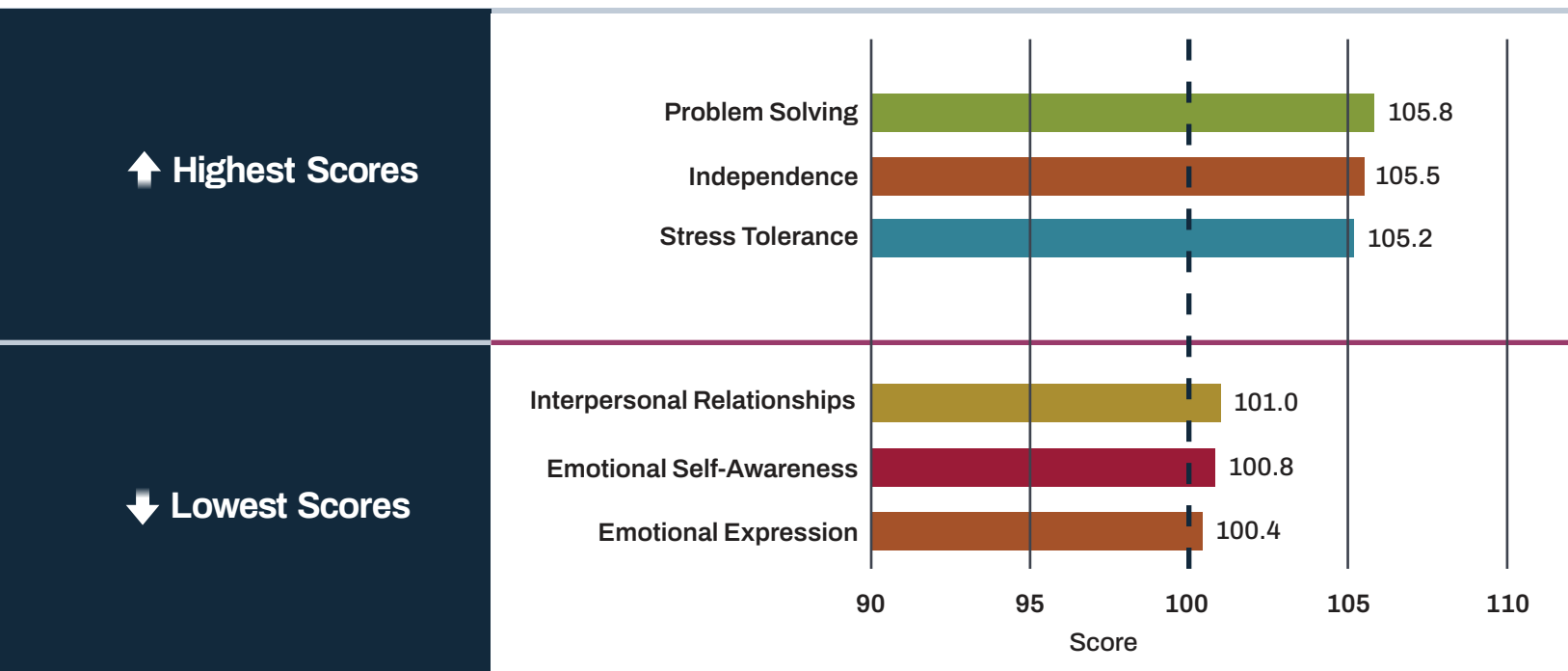
